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### Year 8 Geography Field Study: How is land used along the Cobo Coast Road?

As part of our 'Settlement Unit' of work Year 8 took a few hours to identify how land was being used along four transects of the Cobo Coast Road.

They conducted a bi polar analysis of the areas environmental quality by looking at 11 different factors.



Students then wrote up their findings before evaluating their methods, data presentation techniques and reaching a final conclusion.

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## Inclusion Update

At La Mare High, we work alongside a lot of different agencies and services to ensure that your children are supported.

In our last Inclusion Update, we published information about our island Speech and Language Therapy.

One of those agencies is the **EMHW** team.



This term we welcomed the Youth Commission's new service, the Educational Mental Health and Wellbeing (EMHW) team to our school.

The team is made up of the Senior Mental Health and Wellbeing (MHWB) Manager: Helena Pearson and three Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs): Lizzie Singer, Kerrin Wilkie and Sian Jones.

All three EMHPs are currently training so services will expand with time and we are trialling the process.

The EMHW team delivers evidence-based psychological interventions within school for

young people with mild to moderate mental health issues. The team have also begun to support our mental health lead at La Mare High to develop the whole school approach and this will continue into the new academic year. The team is also available to offer mental health advice to school and parents, in order to help children and young people to get the right support and stay in education.

The team will be working over the summer holidays so as a parent or guardian, if you are concerned about your child's mental health and wellbeing get in touch, and we will see if we are able to support.
